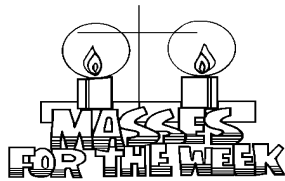

Friends,

My sister has 3 children (Laura, Christina and Matthew). I had the privilege of celebrating her oldest daughter's wedding 2 years ago and she told us this past Mother's Day that she was pregnant. We are thrilled. The child will be my sister and brother-in-law's first grandchild. My niece, Laura, and her husband, John have an apartment in Quincy. It is a very exciting time for them and for their families. I love listening to her talk about the process of being pregnant beginning with the pregnancy test and first visit with the doctor. She is now just beginning to show and realizing that her jeans no longer fit. I know that some women don't get sick at all when they are carrying a child but Laura is nauseous every morning. Like most healthy women she knows that she has to curtail her partying during these 9 months and does all she can to eat the right foods. They want to know the gender of their child and will be able to find out on August 11th. The baby is due on January 4th. Laura is a teacher and she has taken this summer off to enjoy the experience. She is able to spend a lot of quality time with my sister (her mother) who was laid off recently from her job. Laura and her husband have a wonderful relationship. They met at college (Westfield State) and developed a deep friendship as well as falling in love. They have already chosen the name of the child whether a boy or girl. I am observing this experience from the perspective of an uncle and I love every minute of it. I didn't ask her yet what hospital she will choose for the birth. This is one child who will be surrounded with love. Think of all the women in our world who are pregnant at this time. Think of all the joy that this experience is meant to bring to families. Everyone of us goes through the process of maturing physically, emotionally, sexually, intellectually, morally and spiritually. We challenge one another and ourselves to evolve in all these areas as we try to understand what being human is all about. Some do well in certain areas but struggle in others. It's a lifelong process.

As Louis Armstrong sings..."It's a Wonderful World". And we have the privilege of cooperating with God by bringing another generation into it. It is not easy being young and in love today but it is beautiful.

We have concluded our financial year (6-30-08) on a positive note, thanks to you.. We came from a financial hardship of last year to a good place this year. We took care of many needs of the church, ranging from new roofs to new hires such as Robyn Rinehart, Coordinator of the Youth Ministry Program. St. Mary Parish continues to move forward.

We are fortunate to own a beautiful school on Seton Way. This school is home to both our Religious Education Program as well as The Learning Center for the Deaf. The Learning Center is both our friend and tenant. They are a significant contributor to the yearly budget of the Parish. Recently, as we signed a renewal agreement, we noticed several building deficiencies that need repair now and will be costly. We are looking to raise approximately \$20,000 as soon as possible to repair the building.
