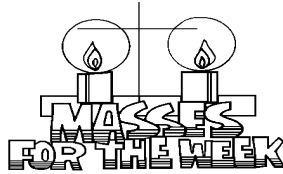

PASTOR'S NOTES

Friends,

As you may know, I read quite a bit and I try to be selective in my choice of books. I focus a lot of my time on books on theology and spirituality since that is my passion. I believe I have the responsibility to continue to grow and evolve in my understanding of God and the role of the Church in the world. I also read novels especially by authors that I enjoy. For me it's like music: if I like a certain artist then want to listen to all of their music. e.g. Josh Groban (also if the truth be told—AC/DC). In the same way, if I have read a book by an author that I like, then I'm tempted to read all their books. e.g. Bishop John Spong (theology) or Jodi Picoult (Novels).

Sometimes if I run out of reading material I'll head to Borders or Barnes & Noble and peruse the shelves. Sometimes a title will jump out at me even if I don't know the author. I look at the table of contents and then read the review on the book cover. If the comments are from authors I respect then I am more than likely to purchase the book. I am very rarely disappointed. My mind is one that needs to be constantly challenged and stimulated. It is hard for me to accept something just because I am told it is true. As St. Paul says in I Corinthians: *"When I was a child I used to think like a child, act like a child and talk like a child, but now that I am an adult I have put away childish things"*.

I recently read a book entitled: "If the Church were Christian" by Philip Gulley. The title sounded interesting. I don't necessarily agree with all he wrote but it sure gave me food for thought. These are the 10 chapters each beginning with: "If the Church were Christian":

1. Jesus would be a model for living, rather than an object of worship.
2. Affirming our potential would be more important than condemning our brokenness.
3. Reconciliation would be valued over judgment.
4. Generous behavior would be more important the right belief.
5. Inviting questions would be more important than supplying answers.
6. Encouraging personal explanation would be more important than communal conformity.
7. Meeting needs would be more important than maintaining institutions.

8. Peace would be more important than powers.
9. It would care more about love and less about sex.
10. This life would be more important than the after life.

Reading has contributed to making my faith stronger and healthier than ever.
